First Class Assignment
Administrative Law

The basic case book is Ronald A. Cass et al., *Administrative Law, Cases and Materials* (5th ed. 2006).

The first class meets Tuesday August 25, from 6:00 - 8:00 pm.

Students should read pages 1 - 38 of the text, plus the following provisions of the United States Constitution, which may be found at pages 887 - 893 of the text: U.S. Const. art 1. sec. 1, art. 1 sec. 7, art. I sec. 8, art. 2 sec. 1 cl. 1, art. 2 sec. 3.

There is a casebook update which I will post on Blackboard once I return from my trip, on about August 18.

As part of the first assignment, students should read the note on page 17 of the Update, on nondelegation doctrine and the TARP legislation.
