## What's New?

### RESTRICTION OF EMPLOYMENT FOR FULL-TIME STUDENTS

The ABA requires that the Law School certifies that all full-time students who are registering for 12 or more credits are not employed more than 20 hours per week during the semester. In satisfaction of this requirement, all full-time students registering for at least 12 credits will need to "Accept" the following statement in order to enroll in classes.

**"As a full-time student registering for 12 credits or more, I hereby certify that I will not work more than 20 hours in any week in which classes are in session."**

### PART-TIME DAY AND EVENING STUDENTS

Effective with the Fall 2009 semester, part-time day and evening students will be restricted to registering for a maximum of 11 credits.

### ADR NOTICE

"The ADR organization will hold its intra-school Honor Board competition early in the Fall semester. All students interested in competing in this competition should also enroll in Dispute Resolution Processes or have taken it in a previous semester."

### SKILLS CURRICULUM

The law school recently expanded the curriculum to provide students with more opportunities for skills courses that focus on participation and simulation, through classroom experiences such as mock trials, drafting contracts, and representing a party in a mediation. The skills curriculum includes not only the required Persuasion and Advocacy course, but also several advanced courses. These courses have limited enrollments (generally 8-12 students per section), thereby allowing significant interaction with and feedback from faculty.

Prior to the Fall 2007 semester, each student was required to fulfill a trial requirement for graduation. However, the trial requirement has been replaced with a skills requirement. The only way to fulfill the new skills requirement is by taking Persuasion and Advocacy. Persuasion and Advocacy is a highly participatory course, in which students learn the art of persuasion. While the course is taught in the context of the courtroom, it teaches skills that should make students better able to argue and more likely to win -- whether in the courtroom, in a corporate transaction, or in another legal negotiation.

Multiple sections of Persuasion and Advocacy will be offered during the Winter 2010 session, which will be scheduled over five days in January (actual dates to be announced) for those students who are interested in taking the course in an accelerated setting.

Persuasion and Advocacy is a prerequisite for several advanced skills courses, and students who are interested in further developing their skills for legal practice should take Persuasion and Advocacy early enough in their law school career to allow room for these advanced courses. Persuasion and Advocacy is a prerequisite for the following courses:

1. Clinics;
2. Advanced Civil Practice;
3. Advanced Criminal Practice;
4. Electronic Discovery
5. NITA Deposition Skills Program
6. Transactional Skills.
7. A Trial of a Civil Matter; and,
8. A Trial of a Criminal Case;

To enroll in Advanced Civil Practice and Advanced Criminal Practice, students must also have completed either the one-semester Evidence course or at least one semester of the full-year Evidence: Theory and Practice course. Advanced Civil Practice is a prerequisite for A Trial of a Civil Matter and Advanced Criminal Practice is a prerequisite for A Trial of a Criminal Case. Other advanced skills courses may be added to the curriculum in future semesters.

Skills courses are also offered in Advanced Arbitration Skills, Advanced Negotiation Skills, and Advanced Mediation Skills. Dispute Resolution Processes is a prerequisite for these three skills courses. Dispute Resolution Processes is also required for students seeking to compete in regional and national ADR competitions.

No more than 15 credits of skills and self-directed work credits shall count towards graduation. Please see below "Limit on Skills and Self-Directed" Work Credits" on page 10.

## WEB REGISTRATION WORKSHEET

Check the registration schedule (see page 5) for your assigned web registration time slot. During the preregistration period, students are assigned times for registration. After April 24, registration is open to all students.

1) Make sure your computer is configured for on-line registration:

Internet Explorer version 5.5 or higher is required; Cookies must be enabled; Pop-ups must be allowed.

2) Login to PirateNet. Click on myInfo tab and then Banner Self-Service link.

3) On the Main Menu, click on **Student and Financial Aid**, then on **Registration**. On the next menu screen, click on **Add or Drop Classes**. Click **Submit** to confirm Fall 2009 as your registration term.

4) Enter the CRNs of your classes in the boxes which appear on the **Add Classes Worksheet**. Press **Submit changes** to submit your course requests. Your schedule will appear; check it for accuracy.

## OUTSTANDING TUITION BALANCE/FINANCIAL HOLDS

It is your responsibility to clear any unpaid balance with the Bursar's Office PRIOR TO registering via the web. Financial holds are automatically placed on your account regardless of the amount due. In addition, all monies must be received prior to the date of your registration, regardless of the source from which the tuition is being paid. If you have a current balance, you will be automatically blocked from registering for courses and will be referred to the Bursar's Office. This will result in having to restart the registration process (if cleared by the Bursar to register) and will reduce your chances of enrolling in your desired courses.

## OTHER HOLDS

There are several types of holds which could affect your registration status, namely: bursar, academic, transcript, health services and financial aid. Prior to registration, it is recommended that you go online to check if you have any type of hold on your account. If one does exist, you should contact the appropriate department to resolve the hold.

## COURSE REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

1. All students registering for full-year courses are required to remain with the same professor during both semesters.
2. All students must register for required courses in the semester in which they are scheduled to be taken within the students' division, unless they receive written permission from the Dean of Students to defer a requirement.
3. Full-time students must register for the majority of their courses within their division unless prior written approval is received from the Dean of Students. Full-time students may register for electives offered in the evening, but do not receive priority for them.
4. Course sections beginning with the letters "A-L" are day courses and sections with the letters "M-Z" are evening courses. Course sections beginning with the letter "E" are available to both day and evening students. **Not all courses offered before 6:05pm are available to evening students.** Evening students should refer to the course section to determine eligibility for enrolling in any course scheduled during the day.
5. Course sections beginning with the letter "Z" are for MSJ students only.

**NOTE:** The Law School schedules courses according to the availability of facilities and instructors. Not all courses and seminars are offered each year. Several courses may be offered only in alternate years. The Law School reserves the right to add, delete, or to change any course, or the credit for any course, at any time. Some courses, and all seminars and clinical programs have limited enrollments. As in other law schools, Seton Hall Law School cannot assure every student the opportunity to take every desired course.

## **PASS/D OR FAIL OPTION POLICY**

Once during a student's last four semesters, he or she may opt to take an elective course (excluding clinics) on a Pass/ D or Fail option. It is entirely up to the professor teaching the course whether he or she chooses to make this option available, and if so, may only be up to a maximum of 20% of the class. The Registrar's Office will determine if more students request the Pass/D or Fail option than there are seats, which students are permitted to take any course Pass/D or Fail. No student may take an AWR course using this option if they need AWR certification for the graduation requirement. Courses that are offered with the option of Pass/D or Fail are noted in the schedule of classes enclosed in this handbook. **A course that is only offered on a Pass/D or Fail basis shall not count as the "one elective" that may be taken on a Pass/D or Fail basis.** If you wish to apply to take a course that is listed as having this option, you may do so by going to:

## **EXAMINATIONS**

Final examinations will not be scheduled until after the Drop/Add period. Students who have an exam conflict can then request a rescheduling of an examination based on the Law School's Conflict Policy. The exam schedule will be posted on our website by the week of September 14<sup>th</sup>.

## **CREDIT LOAD**

A full-time student is required to register for a minimum of twelve credits with a maximum of sixteen credits. This limitation applies to joint degree candidates as well. A part-time day or evening student is required to register for a minimum of eight credits with a maximum of eleven credits. No student on probation will be permitted to register for courses in excess of the maximum set forth in your letter of probation. **Any deviation from the above credit load must be approved in writing by the Associate Dean for Curriculum prior to registering.** For "Credit Limitation" form, please click on below link.

## **RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT**

All students must meet the law school's residency requirements in order to be certified for graduation. A full-time student must be in residence for at least six semesters with a minimum of 10 credits each semester and a part-time student must be in residence for at least eight semesters with a minimum of eight credits each semester. Any student who has changed divisions or is seeking to graduate a semester early must check with the Registrar in order to insure compliance with this requirement.

## DROP/ADD PROCEDURES

The Drop/Add period consists of the first week of classes -- Monday, August 24 – Sunday, August 30. **No student will be permitted to drop/add after the first week of classes, nor will any student receive academic credit who is not officially registered by Sunday, August 30.**

## COURSE WITHDRAWAL

A student is permitted to withdraw from a course up until the day of the scheduled examination, or if self-scheduled, the last day of examinations. In the case of a seminar, a student may withdraw up to the day in which the paper is due. However, no student may attempt more than 95 credits of academic work, including retaken courses. A course from which a student withdraws with the approval of the Dean of Students does not count as an attempted course. Notwithstanding the above, any student who is involuntarily withdrawn or who withdraws, with or without approval, from more than 20 credits will be automatically dismissed.

Students seeking to withdraw from one course while retaining another after the Drop/Add period must complete an "Adjustment Form" with the Registrar's Office.

**No refund of tuition is granted for any withdrawals from a course, program, clinic or journal after the Drop/Add period. A student withdrawing from any of the above will receive a grade of "WD" (Withdrawal).**

## CLASS CANCELLATIONS

Students will be notified by phone or e-mail in the event a course is cancelled. If a course is cancelled, a student has the following options, (1) drop the course and receive a full refund or (2) replace the cancelled course with another course.

## January 2010 DEGREE APPLICATION

All LLM, JD, and MSJ candidates who intend to complete degree requirements after the Fall 2009 semester, must file the online "Application for Graduation" form with the Registrar's Office. Applications must be received by 6:00 pm, Friday, August 28. ***Failure to file this application may result in the student's graduation date being the next available date after the succeeding semester.*** You can access the form by going to:

## **LIMIT ON SKILLS AND SELF-DIRECTED WORK CREDITS**

No more than 15 credits of skills and self-directed work credits shall count towards graduation. This would include skills courses (excluding Persuasion and Advocacy), journals, externships, moot court (excluding Appellate Advocacy), Independent Research, and clinics (non-classroom component only). ## **APPELLATE ADVOCACY**

Appellate Advocacy is a two credit required course that meets once a week in sections of no more than 16 students. Each section will be taught by an instructor with the assistance of a member of the Moot Court Board, who will focus on brief writing skills, advocacy strategy and oral argument skills.

Students receive a letter grade for the course, based upon completion of an appellate brief, a final round of oral argument, and participation in class and conferences. Students will prepare drafts and a final brief on a one-issue moot court problem, present several practice rounds of oral argument and one graded round, and meet in individual conferences with the instructor.

Students customarily register for Appellate Advocacy in the first semester of the second year (day division), second semester of the second year (part-time day division) or in the first semester of the third year (evening division). New law journal members are advised to wait until Spring semester to register for Appellate Advocacy. This sequence allows the maximum opportunity for students to participate in the Gressman Competition, the Interscholastic Moot Court Board and the Appellate Advocacy Moot Court Board. This traditional sequence also affords students maximum flexibility in completing the AWR requirement, course selection, clinical participation, and other academic/co-curricular activities.

## ADVANCED WRITING REQUIREMENT

All students are required to fulfill a substantial writing requirement for graduation. The following courses offered will fulfill this requirement. The courses listed are the only courses offered during the Fall 2009 semester which will fulfill the **Advanced Writing Requirement**.

**NOTE: Students who enroll in the above courses must meet AWR standards even if they do not need AWR certification.**

For all papers which are intended to satisfy the Advanced Writing Requirement, the professor must agree that the topic is appropriate for advanced legal writing credit. After completion of the paper, the professor must certify to the Registrar that the paper satisfies the Advanced Writing Requirement. At the option of the professor, this certification may be based on revisions which are made after the student has received a final grade in the seminar. Revisions made after the conclusion of the seminar shall not result in any change in the final grade.

The following also qualify for the Advanced Writing Requirement:

- A student note or comment by a member of the Seton Hall Law Review, Legislative Journal, Sports and Entertainment Law and Circuit Review which is certified by the faculty member supervising the paper.
- The problem and bench memorandum used for the Eugene Gressman Appellate Moot Court Competition. (The Spring moot court director is solely responsible for selecting and developing the Spring problem.)
- The bench memorandum used for the John J. Gibbons national Criminal Procedure Moot Court Competition.

## SKILLS REQUIREMENT

All students must take Persuasion and Advocacy to fulfill the skills requirement. Multiple sections of Persuasion and Advocacy are offered in the Fall 2009 semester. In addition, multiple sections of Persuasion and Advocacy will be offered during the 2009 Winter Session, (actual dates to be announced) for those students who are interested in taking the course in an accelerated full-day setting."

## CREDIT FOR JOURNALS

1. As an editor of the Law Review, eight is the maximum number of journal credits that may be earned.
2. As a member/editor of the Sports & Entertainment Law Journal, Legislative Journal or Circuit Review, six is the maximum number of journal credits that may be earned.
3. As a member of any journal, the maximum number of journal credits that may be earned is six.
4. No journal member/editor may register for more than three journal credits in any semester.

## CLINICS

Students may **not** receive credit towards graduation for more than twelve credits of clinical work. Interested students should have already made application to the clinic. Selection to a clinic may not be announced prior to registration.

### CLINIC REQUIREMENTS - Minimum 2.60 GPA

Students on academic probation are ineligible to register for a clinic unless GPA requirements are waived by the Associate Dean after being recommended for waiver by the clinic director.

**Evidence** - This course is a prerequisite for any clinic which permits students to appear in court under the "Student Practice" rule section of the New Jersey Court Rules.

**Persuasion and Advocacy and Professional Responsibility** These courses are prerequisites for any clinic.

### INDEPENDENT RESEARCH - Minimum 3.00 GPA

Students interested in registering for Independent Research must complete the online form at [http://law.shu.edu/administration/registrar\\_bursar/forms/independent\\_research\\_form.pdf](http://law.shu.edu/administration/registrar_bursar/forms/independent_research_form.pdf) and obtain the appropriate signatures of the faculty advisor and the Independent Research Committee members. Upon submission of the approval form, students will be registered for the course, but in no case will any student be registered later than the end of the Drop/Add period (first week of the semester). It is the student's responsibility to insure that the completed form is returned to the Registrar's Office before the end of the Drop/Add period.

## EXTERNSHIPS

Seton Hall Law has a broad range of Externship Programs with approximately 65 not-for-profit and governmental organizations, with judges of approved courts, and with select entertainment organizations. The Externship Programs provide students the opportunity to obtain academic credit for interning with approved organizations, provided all requirements are met. **JUDICIAL EXTERNSHIP** - Completion of a minimum of 25 credits and 2.60 GPA for full-time students. Minimum of 22 credits and 2.60 GPA for part-time day and evening students (2.80 GPA if less than 25 credits completed).

All students interested in registering for the Judicial Externship Program may obtain application materials online (see below). Students need to submit their completed “Statement of Appointment” form to Ms. Dorothea Harris, secretary, Student Services’ Office for approval by Professor McLaughlin, Director of the Judicial Externship Program. Professor McLaughlin will review the application and determine whether the student is eligible to register for credit -- the Associate Dean does not have the ability to waive the GPA or credit requirement for judicial externships. Applications must be submitted and approval granted prior to the end of the Drop/Add period. Preference will be given to graduating students. All other openings will be filled in order of application. ## **CLASS ATTENDANCE POLICY**

The Law School has a recommended Class Attendance Policy which calls for students to attend a minimum of 75% of class sessions in a course or be administratively withdrawn from the course. No excused absences are permitted. An absence for any reason, including late registration, counts towards the maximum of 25% absences allowed.

Individual faculty may adopt an alternate procedure for monitoring attendance, provided it is at least as restrictive as the school's policy. Each faculty member shall announce his/her policy regarding attendance (including, if applicable, that attendance will not be taken), at the first class session of each semester. Professors may, in their sole discretion, refuse to allow a student to sign an attendance sheet, or request that a signature be voided if the student is not in attendance for a sufficient portion of the class.

Signing an attendance sheet on behalf of another student constitutes a violation of the Code of Student Conduct. Such violations will be reported to the Associate Dean.
