Professor Risinger is the John J. Gibbons Professor of Law Emeritus at Seton Hall University School of Law. He holds a B.A., *magna cum laude* from Yale University, and a J.D., *cum laude* from Harvard Law School. He is a past chair of the Association of American Law Schools (“AALS”) Section on Civil Procedure, a past chair of the AALS Section on Evidence, a life member of the American Law Institute, and was for 25 years a member of the New Jersey Supreme Court Committee on Evidence, which was responsible for the current version of the New Jersey Rules of Evidence.

He was a member of the Human Factors Subcommittee of the National Commission on Forensic Science until that Commission’s sad demise in April of 2017, and he was a member of the Human Factors Resource Committee of the Organization of Scientific Area Committees (OSAC) of the National Institute for Science and Technology (NIST) until 2022.

He is the author of two chapters in Faigman, Kaye, Cheng and Mnookin, *Modern Scientific Evidence* (“Handwriting Identification” and “A Proposed Taxonomy of Expertise”). He is also the author of dozens of articles and book chapters on a diverse range of subjects, including many articles on expert evidence issues, on the nature of inference, and on issues concerning the plight of the convicted innocent.

In addition, he is Associate Director of the Last Resort Exoneration Project at Seton Hall.

In January of 2017, he was awarded the John Henry Wigmore Award for Lifetime Achievement in Elucidating the Law of Evidence and the Process of Proof by the Evidence Section of the AALS.
