

**Professor and Executive Director of the Rodino Law Library Center for Information & Technology

Seton Hall University School of Law seeks to fill the position of Professor and Executive Director of the Peter W. Rodino, Jr. Law Library Center for Information and Technology (the “Rodino Center Director”). Named after Peter W. Rodino, Jr.—a congressman from New Jersey who served as chairman of the House Judiciary Committee and oversaw the impeachment process against President Richard Nixon—the Rodino Center brings together library and information technology professionals, as well as law practice and educational technology expertise, providing a streamlined research experience for our students: <https://law.shu.edu/rodino-center/index.cfm>

In addition to overseeing all aspects of the Rodino Center’s operations, the Rodino Center Director, like other tenured/tenure track faculty members, will also teach and produce legal scholarship, which can include scholarship in topics relating to issues in librarianship, pedagogy, technology, and cognate fields. If untenured upon hire, the successful candidate will initially be hired at the Associate Professor (untenured level) and will be expected to proceed along a standard tenure timeline for Law School faculty.

Candidates must hold both a JD and an MLIS or equivalent degree. The successful candidate must have a demonstrated track record for leadership potential in a law library setting, including skills related to budgeting, introducing technological innovations, collaborating with and supervising colleagues, and strategic planning.

Candidates must also be able to demonstrate (i) strong scholarly promise, (ii) the ability or potential to be an outstanding teacher who can motivate students while preparing them for the practice of law in the twenty-first century, and (iii) leadership in service toward building an equitable and diverse academic community.

Seton Hall Law School offers a vibrant, energetic academic environment. Located in downtown Newark, New Jersey, approximately 20 minutes from Manhattan, Seton Hall Law is especially well-regarded in the health and life sciences law, intellectual property, cybersecurity, and privacy arenas, and it is in the process of expanding its role in energy, technology and data analytics.
