On July 1, 2013, Jeremy A. Farrell was appointed Corporation Counsel for the City of Jersey City. Mr. Farrell heads the Department of Law, which represents Jersey City in all legal matters and advises the Mayor and City Council on legislation and policy initiatives.

Mr. Farrell is a 2003 graduate of McGill University where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science and International Development. He received his Juris Doctorate from Seton Hall University School of Law in 2007. While attending Seton Hall Law School, Mr. Farrell was a Chancellor Scholar and Distinguished Scholar. He also served as a member of the Seton Hall Sports and Entertainment Law Journal and a Student Bar

Association Senator.

Upon graduating from law school in 2007, Mr. Farrell joined McElroy, Deutsch, Mulvaney & Carpenter, LLP (“McElroy”), one of New Jersey’s prominent law firms. In 2008, he left McElroy to serve as Judicial Law Clerk to the Honorable Dennis M. Cavanaugh, United States District Judge for the District of New Jersey. He returned to the firm in the fall of 2009.
