This packet contains the descriptions of the scholarships that will be awarded for the upcoming academic year. We've attempted to streamline the application process, so you only need to complete one scholarship application and attach the pertinent essays. In addition to the scholarships listed in this packet, we may use this application to help us award a few other need-based scholarships.

Submission Instructions:

Submit the following:

- Page 1 and 2 of the Scholarship Application
- Your resume
- Your unofficial law school transcript
- Attach the corresponding essays. Essay topics are listed under the scholarship descriptions.
- Include the scholarship name at the top of each page for each essay submitted. You may submit multiple essays (separate pages.)
- Submit all documents in one.pdf file.

Scholarship Descriptions / Essay Questions

The Andrew B. Crummy Endowed Scholarship is awarded to a **rising 2nd or 3rd year full-time JD student**. Applicants must have filed a current year FAFSA, have financial need, and have demonstrated academic excellence. (No essay is required.)

The Michael Ambrosio and Janice Gordon Endowed Scholarship is awarded to a **2L or 3L JD student** based on financial need and a demonstrated commitment to community service. (No essay is required.)

The Class of 2018 Scholarship is awarded to a **3L or 4L JD student** who has financial need and will be graduating in May 2019.

The Professor John and Rose Marie Deehan Memorial Endowed Scholarship is awarded to a **rising 3rd year JD student** who: has ascertained financial need; has excelled in the area of Business and Corporate Law or Taxation during law school; has a strong aptitude for, and interest in, business ethics; and has demonstrated leadership abilities. Preference will be given to students who have demonstrated or expressed commitment to Business and Corporate Law or Taxation through undergraduate area of study or law school coursework.

Essay: Please submit an essay that illustrates your qualifications for this scholarship in light of the above criteria.

The Alfred F. Jablonski Scholarship is awarded to a full-time JD student (any year) with a proven record of academic success and who possesses financial need. Preference is given to candidates who are of Polish descent.

Essay: Please submit an essay on the following topic: "As a prospective attorney of Polish descent, submit an essay of approximately 300 words on the influence of Polish Culture in America."

The William B McGuire Scholarship is awarded to a **rising 3rd year JD student** who possesses financial need, and has preferably, lived the majority of his/her life in NJ, and has overcome an obstacle in his/her life.

Essay: Please submit a short essay that outlines an obstacle in your life and how that challenge was overcome.

The **Honorable John C. Palmieri Endowed Scholarship**, created by Rina S. and John C. Gibbons, will be awarded to a **rising 2nd or 3rd year JD student** who has demonstrated academic excellence while in law school (3.0 or above) and who possesses financial need. Preference will be given to those who have worked for a federal judge while in law school. The student must submit an essay that illustrates their community involvement or extracurricular activities and future career goals.

Essay: Please submit an essay that illustrates your community involvement or extracurricular activities and future career goals.

The Sue Salkind Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a 2L JD student with financial need who has maintained a B average. (No essay is required.)

Trial Advocacy Scholarships (2) - The American Board of Trial Advocates-North Jersey Chapter (ABOTA) and the **Keefe Bartels Scholarship** - awarded to a **rising 3rd year JD student** that has a keen desire to become a civil trial lawyer and who demonstrates well above average aptitude in that area, excellence as a student, and who has the financial need for scholarship dollars. An interview may be required for selected applicants. The recipient of the ABOTA scholarship will be invited to a scholarship awards dinner in early September 2018.

Essay: Please submit an essay that demonstrates your qualifications in light of the above criteria.
