

Amani Toomer, former Wide Receiver & Super Bowl Champion, NY Giants and Trustee, Entain-US Foundation



Amani Toomer is a former American wide receiver and punt returner who played his entire career for the New York Giants of the National Football League. He registered over 1,000 receiving yards each season from 1999 to 2003, was a member of the 2007 Giants team that won Super Bowl XLII and holds Giants' club records with 9,497 receiving yards, 668 receptions and 54 receiving touchdowns. He also returned 109 punts for 1,060 yards and three touchdowns. As a rookie in 1996, he led the NFL with an average of 16.6 yards on 18 punt returns. In 2009, Amani entered the Giant's ring of honor.

Amani played college football at the University of Michigan from 1992 to 1995. In 1994, he broke the school's single-season record with 1,096 receiving yards and was a finalist for the Billetnikoff Award and a first-team All-Big Ten honoree. Amani finished his college career ranked second (now fourth) in Michigan history with 2,657 receiving yards.

Amani joined Entain Foundation US (formerly GVC Foundation US) as one of its trustees in 2019.
