Assistant United States Attorney Anthony Torntore serves as Chief of the District of New Jersey's Cybercrime Unit where he oversees a team of AUSAs who investigate and prosecute cybercrime cases including malware and ransomware campaigns, major hacks targeting corporations, financial institutions, accounting firms and government networks, and cyber-enabled frauds such as business email compromises and account takeovers. Prior to joining the United States Attorney's Office, AUSA Torntore spent seven years as a Deputy Attorney General with the State of New Jersey's Division

of Criminal Justice where he prosecuted and tried a wide range of financial and computer crimes cases involving child exploitation and abuse, securities fraud, money laundering, and racketeering. AUSA Torntore received his bachelor's degree from the College of New Jersey and his law degree from Seton Hall University School of Law.
