Cyrus Pitre has served as a leading regulator in the gaming industry for more than 30 years, holding key positions in Louisiana, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. He has litigated and resolved numerous landmark cases that have shaped gaming law and regulatory practices across multiple jurisdictions.

Mr. Pitre began his career in 1996 as an Assistant Attorney General with Louisiana's Division of Gaming, where he helped establish regulatory standards, litigated landmark cases, and advised the Louisiana State Police on all gaming related matters. In 2001, he was appointed Deputy Attorney General with New Jersey's Division of Gaming Enforcement, prosecuting violations of the Casino Control Act.

Since 2007, Mr. Pitre has served as Chief Enforcement Counsel for the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board. In this role, he oversees compliance and enforcement under Pennsylvania's Race Horse Development and Gaming Act, Video Gaming Act, and Fantasy Contests Act. His responsibilities include directing investigations, initiating enforcement actions, and petitioning for remedies to safeguard the integrity of gaming and protect Pennsylvania citizens.

Over the course of his career, Mr. Pitre has gained extensive experience regulating diverse forms of gaming, including land-based and riverboat casinos, online and mobile gaming, sports wagering, horse racing, tavern gaming, fantasy contests, charitable gaming, skill-based games, and video gaming terminals in multiple venues.

Mr. Pitre earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Louisiana and his Juris Doctor from Southern University Law Center. He is licensed to practice law in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Louisiana.
