Dr. Davide Tuzzolino is a Non-Resident Fellow in the Seton Hall University School of Law's Gibbons Institute of Law, Science & Technology and Institute for Privacy Protection. He is a U.S.–Italy Fulbright Awarded Visiting Postdoctoral Research Scholar at Seton Hall University, where he designed and teaches the Fulbright course “Artificial Intelligence and Law”. He also serves on the Artificial Intelligence Advisory Council (AIAC) at the same Institution. His research focuses on European private law and digital governance, with particular attention to artificial intelligence and other emerging technologies, including digital services, digital identity, cloud computing, blockchain, Internet of Things, smart cities, non-fungible tokens, and robotics. His work places particular emphasis on data protection and governance, contract law, intellectual property, cybersecurity, liability, and digital regulatory frameworks. His scholarly contributions include peer-reviewed publications in leading journals and presentations at major academic conferences and professional forums.

In Italy, Dr. Tuzzolino is a Research Associate at the Mediterranea International Centre for Human Rights Research (MICHR) and has been collaborating with LUISS Guido Carli University since 2021. He has also worked with prominent European universities and research centers, including the Just AI Lab at the University of Stirling (Scotland, UK), contributing to interdisciplinary research initiatives examining how national and European legal systems adapt to technological innovation, including participation in research projects funded at both national and European levels.

Alongside his academic activity, Dr. Tuzzolino is a qualified lawyer (avvocato) admitted to the Italian Bar before the Court of Appeal of Rome. His practice focuses on civil and commercial law, intellectual property, data protection and governance, cybersecurity, digital services, and artificial intelligence, covering advisory and litigation matters. He also serves as Data Protection Officer for several companies.

He holds an Integrated (five years) Master's Degree in Law (J.D.) - 2015, and a Second-Level Postgraduate Master's Degree (LL.M.) - 2019 from Sapienza University of Rome, a Postgraduate Specialization Diploma for the Legal Profession - 2017, and a Doctoral Degree (Ph.D.) in Private Law - 2023 from the European University of Rome.
