Donna Kelly is currently an Adjunct Professor of Election Law at Seton Hall University School of Law. She is a former Assistant Attorney General for the State of New Jersey with over 34 years of experience in election matters, including voting rights and ballot access. She served as counsel to the Secretary of State and the county superintendents of elections and boards of election. She has regularly lectured on election matters for various groups, most recently for the Kenyan government in preparation for the 2022 Presidential Election. She was an Adjunct Professor for the Center for Government Services, Rutgers University from 2005-2015 assisting in the development of various course for State election officials. Kelly has a B.A. in political science from Rutgers College and a J.D. from Seton Hall University School of Law, where she served as Student Director of the Legislative Bureau.
