Dr. Matthew H. Hersch is a Fellow and Adjunct Professor of Law, Gibbons Institute of Law, Science & Technology at Seton Hall University School of Law. He studies technology, risk, and the ethics and professional responsibilities of engineers. He received his SB in Political Science from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, his JD from New York University School of Law, and his AM and PhD in the History and Sociology of Science from the University of Pennsylvania, during which he held a Daniel and Florence Guggenheim Fellowship at the Smithsonian Institution's National Air and Space Museum and a History of Science Society/National Aeronautics and Space Administration Fellowship in the History of Space Science. He has held faculty appointments in Penn's School of Arts and Sciences, School of Engineering and Applied Science, and College of Liberal and Professional Studies; the University of Southern California; Harvard University's Department of the History of Science; and NYU Law, where he is a Samuel I. Golieb Fellow in Legal History. Dr. Hersch has also held a Visitorship at the Institute for Advanced Study, and Fellowships with the American Council of Learned Societies/Heyman Center for the Humanities at Columbia University and the Huntington-USC Institute on California and the West. He is the author of *Dark Star: A New History of the Space Shuttle* (MIT Press, 2023), *Inventing the American Astronaut* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2012), co-author of *A Social History of American Technology, 2nd Edition* (Oxford University Press, 2018), and co-editor of *War and Peace in Outer Space: Ethical and Legal Boundaries* (Oxford University Press, 2021).
