Tim is the Managing Director and Chief Legal Officer of OneTeam Partners, LLC (OneTeam).

OneTeam was formed in late 2019 by the National Football League Players Association (NFLPA), Major League Baseball Players Association (MLBPA) and RedBird Capital Partners. It has established itself as a leading global sports licensing, marketing, media and investment company.

The business was built to test the idea that players from different sports could build a bigger business together than they could operating independently. Initially, its goal was to accelerate the commercial interests and opportunity of its founders – the NFL players and MLB players. Since that time, OneTeam has expanded to represent more than 10,000 players competing not only in the NFL and MLB, but also the WNBA, MLS, U.S. Women's National Team, NWSL, U.S. Rugby, and the LCS, as well as college athletes. In its most recent valuation, the business was valued at \$1.9B.

A founding executive, Tim leads various initiatives to develop existing and new revenue opportunities, and manages company-wide legal matters. Prior to his current position, he was the President of MLB Players, Inc., a wholly-owned subsidiary of the MLBPA. In that role, he guided MLB players in their commercial relationships with Major League Baseball and its member Clubs, licensees, sponsors, agents and other strategic partners.

He has been recognized as a member of Sports Business Journal's *Forty Under 40*. Tim was also featured in a leading sports magazine as a "rising executive helping to shape the next era of baseball business." Tim started his legal career at the US Department of Justice in Washington, DC. Before joining the MLBPA, he was with the law firm of Simpson Thacher and Bartlett, practicing out of its offices in New York and Hong Kong. He is a graduate of Georgetown University Law Center and the College of William and Mary.
